St Catherine's Primary School is a Catholic School for children of 4 to 11 years of age. We are part of the Parish of St. John Boste and in September 2024, joined the Mater Christi Multi Academy Trust.

The Catholic faith of the parish inspired the building of the school in the 1870s and continues to be a major part of its daily life and learning. We use the teachings of the Catholic Faith as the basis. for our curriculum but it is not a requirement that you are a Catholic to attend our school; at present we are approximately 50% Catholic

We also have a number of non-Catholic Staff which helps us to be fully inclusive in our approach to RE and teaching skills for life. The school, next to the church in Drovers Lane, has flourished for over a hundred years.

We are very fortunate to have excellent facilities which include five classrooms, a large Hall, a library and Maths room. Outdoors, we have our own large playing field, a secure playground with a wooden Trim Trail, wildlife areas and a fully functioning allotment!

The School Day

The information below reflects the planned school day.

Reception and Key Stage 1: 8.50am – 12.00pm 1pm - 3:15pm

Key Stage 2

The school gate opens at 8.40am when teacher

supervision begins on the playground. School responsibility for the children ends at 3.30pm when every child should have been collected, unless attending an after school club or activity.

Our Curriculum

As we state in our Mission Statement and set out in the aims of our school; we want to provide our pupils with an exciting curriculum which will:

- challenge their abilities;
- build their confidence;
- establish their resilience and prepare them for life.



In Reception and Key Stage 1, there is a strong emphasis on phonics and reading as these skills are at the root of learning. The Maths and English skills are developed further through challenging topics, which the children themselves help devise; this ensures the children enjoy their time at school, learning in a variety of different ways.

We have clear assessment procedures in order to personalise lessons to best serve the needs of our children and parents are regularly invited into school to view learning in action and discuss their child's progress. We use a mentoring approach to assessment which establishes targets for learning and reinforces good attitudes to learning. St. Catherine's is an active member of the Eden Valley Sports Partnership and regularly takes part in competitions and galas.





Human Relationships & Sex Education is fully integrated into our RE and Science Curriculum. The policy, which was approved by the Diocese of Lancaster Education Service, is available on request.





<u>SEND</u>

Our school recognises the needs of the most able and least able of all pupils. If, through our extensive experience, your child was identified as needing support, parents would be fully consulted. Full details of our SEND policy are available on the school website or on request from school.

School Dinners

A healthy lunch is available, cooked on the premises. Special dietary needs can be catered for and all menus are available on the school website. School Meals are available free of charge up to the age of 7. Details of our school hub, the online ordering and payment service, are available at the Induction morning or from Diane, School Business Manager in the office. Your child can bring a packed lunch if you prefer.





Wrap around care

St. Catherine's operates a term time breakfast club from 8am – 8:50am. The cost is £3 per day.

We also operate a term time after school club Monday – Thursday inclusive, until 5:30pm. The cost is £6 per day.

Wrap around care should be booked a week in advance.



<u>Attendance</u>

We believe that if a pupil is to benefit from education, good attendance is crucial and the attendance of pupils is closely monitored by the Governors. Parents/carers are asked to contact the school as soon as possible in the event of absence. Please telephone the office after 8.30am on the first day of absence.

Authorisation for absence in term time can only be given in exceptional circumstances; Parents are reminded that holidays should be taken during designated school breaks.



Discipline and Behaviour

The school as a family, alongside our school values of respect, resilience and kindness, forms the basis of our approach to behaviour and discipline. We seek to recognise each child as an individual whose dignity as a person should always be respected. Good behaviour is expected and rewarded, in this way we foster the child's self-esteem. Adults strive to be good role models and deal with the children in an atmosphere of openness, honesty and forgiveness.

We aim to provide a safe environment where children are respected, yet can mature through experience. Teachers have a right to teach and children have a right to learn in a classroom where good behaviour is respected and encouraged.

The school needs to be able to rely on the support of parents with regard to attendance, dress and general behaviour. In cases of serious persistent misbehaviour where previous intervention has not succeeded, formal action will be taken, as specified in the school behaviour policy, ratified by the governing body. This may involve exclusion from school. A full copy of the school behaviour policy is available on request.
