Impact on Pupils’ Participation and Attainment

The funding has delivered significant improvements across key areas:

Staff Confidence and Skills

- External coaching support provided practical strategies and mentoring, enabling staff to implement progressive and inclusive activities.
- Internal development sessions encouraged collaboration and sharing of best practices, creating a consistent approach to PE across the school.
- Increased Participation
 - Extra-curricular sports clubs have grown, with more pupils attending regularly.
 - Pupils now have more opportunities to represent the school in inter-school competitions and events.
- Enhanced Opportunities
 - All Children, including those with disabilities have been given the opportunity to participate in competitions and / or extra-curricular activities.

- Pupils have been introduced to a wider range of sports, promoting enjoyment and lifelong physical activity habits.
- Active travel initiatives and swimming top-ups have supported pupils in meeting national activity and water safety standards.
- OPAL play to develop playtimes and lunchtimes for all children.

PE and swimming attainment:

- 75% of Year 6 pupils can swim 25m competently and use a range of strokes effectively.
- 75% can perform safe self-rescue in various water-based situations

Sustainability of Improvements

To ensure long-term benefits:

- Staff training (CPD) has built the capacity to deliver high-quality PE lessons independently.
- Extra-curricular and competitive opportunities are embedded within the school calendar.
- A strong focus on inclusivity ensures that all pupils, regardless of background or ability,
- continue to access sport
- Promoting active lunchtimes to increase activity throughout the school week.
