### Impact on Pupils’ Participation and Attainment

The funding has delivered significant improvements across key areas:

#### Staff Confidence and Skills

- All teaching staff have engaged in CPD sessions, leading to greater confidence and competence in delivering high-quality PE lessons.
- External coaching support provided practical strategies and mentoring, enabling staff to implement progressive and inclusive activities.

- Internal development sessions encouraged collaboration and sharing of best practices, creating a consistent approach to PE across the school.
- Increased Participation
  - Extra-curricular sports clubs have grown, with more pupils attending regularly.
  - Pupils now have more opportunities to represent the school in inter-school competitions and events.
- Enhanced Opportunities
  - Specialist activities such as dance and gymnastics have improved engagement among girls.
  - Pupils have been introduced to a wider range of sports, promoting enjoyment and lifelong physical activity habits.
  - Active travel initiatives and swimming top-ups have supported pupils in meeting national activity and water safety standards.

**PE and swimming attainment:**

- 80% of Year 6 pupils can swim 25m competently and use a range of strokes effectively.
- 75% can perform safe self-rescue in various water-based situations

To ensure long-term benefits:

- Staff training (CPD) has built the capacity to deliver high-quality PE lessons independently.
- Investment in durable sports equipment supports ongoing curriculum delivery.
